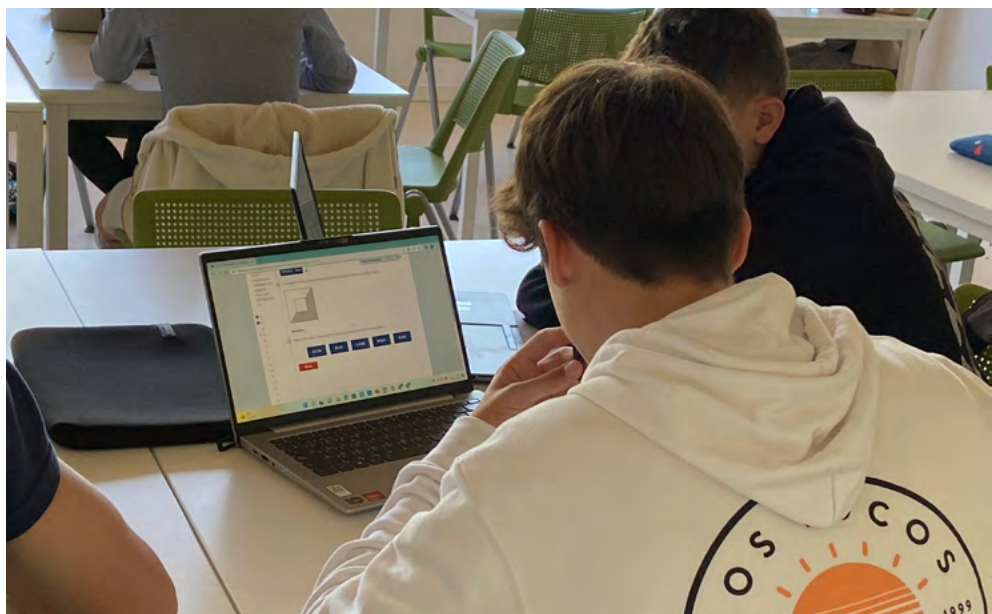

Here they faced 25 challenging questions which tested their ability to apply creative thinking to their mathematical knowledge in order to solve problems. This prestigious, international competition is a fantastic opportunity for our talented students to really test themselves by applying maths in unfamiliar contexts and it will certainly help to deepen their general understanding of the subject. We look forward to receiving the results soon and we have high hopes of achieving a number of gold, silver and bronze certificates.

INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE NEWS

Year 13 Biology and Physics Internal Assessments

On Monday 19th September, the students in Year 13 studying Biology and Physics started the vital process of their internal assessments. This is a piece of unique research involving a scientific experiment which counts as 20% of their final grade in these subjects. Everyone was encouraged to come up with their own topic, based on their own interests, and everyone responded to the challenge with great enthusiasm.

Over the last three weeks we have been running experiments and investigations looking into a wide range of topics. In Biology, there has been an investigation looking into the ability of tea to aid in protein digestion, another that is trying to determine whether caffeine from coffee grains will impact the ability of seeds to germinate, and another looking at whether wasted energy drinks could potentially have a negative impact on the ability of aquatic plants to photosynthesise.

In Physics, there were experiments ranging from an investigation looking at whether temperature has an effect on the elasticity of materials, to an experiment conducted to find out if the surface tension of water was affected by different objects hitting it. Then there was another that involved looking at whether if you cook popcorn at different temperatures, that temperature has an effect on the kinetic energy within the popcorn when it pops. The labs smelt fabulous during that last one!

Everyone has demonstrated fantastic levels of enthusiasm for their own projects, and excellent understanding of the scientific method.

Now the data collection stage is over, students have to work on their own to complete their write up. The deadline for their first full draft is **November 14th**.

The practical sessions for the Chemistry IAs will take place after half term.

Year 12 IB students - Extended Essay

It is important students know how to choose sources that are reliable and relevant to them and how to acknowledge the work of others. In this workshop, Y12 students were learning more about APA, our referencing system for DP students and in-text citations.

The Duke of Edinburgh's International Award Practice Expedition

Friday 4th November to Saturday 5th November

A year ago we successfully launched The Duke of Edinburgh's International Award here at BCG. We had a fantastic uptake from students, and over the last year participants have been working hard to meet their own personal goals set in learning a new skill, in a physical activity and in a volunteering activity. Now it is time for the final section - the Adventurous Journey.

On Friday 4th November, students from Years 11, 12 and 13 will be setting out on their Duke of Edinburgh Practice Expedition. This is open to **all students** from these years, including those who have not signed up to the Award, and will be **free of charge**. Over the past 5 weeks everyone has been working hard to learn the required skills and prepare for over 24 hours of being completely self-sufficient.

The expedition will be around the Castelldefels and Gava area, providing an excellent opportunity for students to experience amazing areas of nature that are right on their doorstep! We will meet at Port Ginesta at 9am on Friday 4th November (students will have to make their own way there), where students will then either

start off on their planned route or be taken to the start point in the school minibus. They will then begin their planned route: exploring the world around them while supervised by staff, and making their way to the school. Students will be out for over 6 hours of planned activity. An important reminder for parents: participants have to be as self-sufficient as possible for the duration of this expedition, which means they must take everything they need with them.

This will then be followed by a camping experience in the school grounds, during which students will be cooking their own meals, and on Saturday morning following a self-cooked breakfast and packing up their camp, there will be another exploration. This time of the beautiful natural areas around Gava Mar. Students will be expected to do 4 hours of purposeful activity on Saturday morning, finishing back at the school ready for pick up.

To succeed students will have to work closely as a team and be responsible for one another, and everyone has developed their teamwork skills through a variety of challenges and tasks in school. They are now working in their groups to plan the route of their expedition while also gathering the final pieces of their kit. This expedition is focused on being climate friendly, with minimal emissions and as little impact on the environment as possible, so students are encouraged to organise amongst themselves how to share the key pieces of camp kit that they will need.

It is our aim to cultivate a love for the natural beauty of our amazing location, and we know that everyone is going to have a fantastic time while also demonstrating that they have the required skills to be entered in for the qualifying expeditions that will take place later in the school year.

Hopefully this will also inspire some of our newer students to sign up to the Award, and to find out what they too can achieve if they set their mind to it!

The deadline for authorisation has been extended to **Friday 14th October**. Parents, please authorise your child's attendance on this expedition on the [school booking system](#).

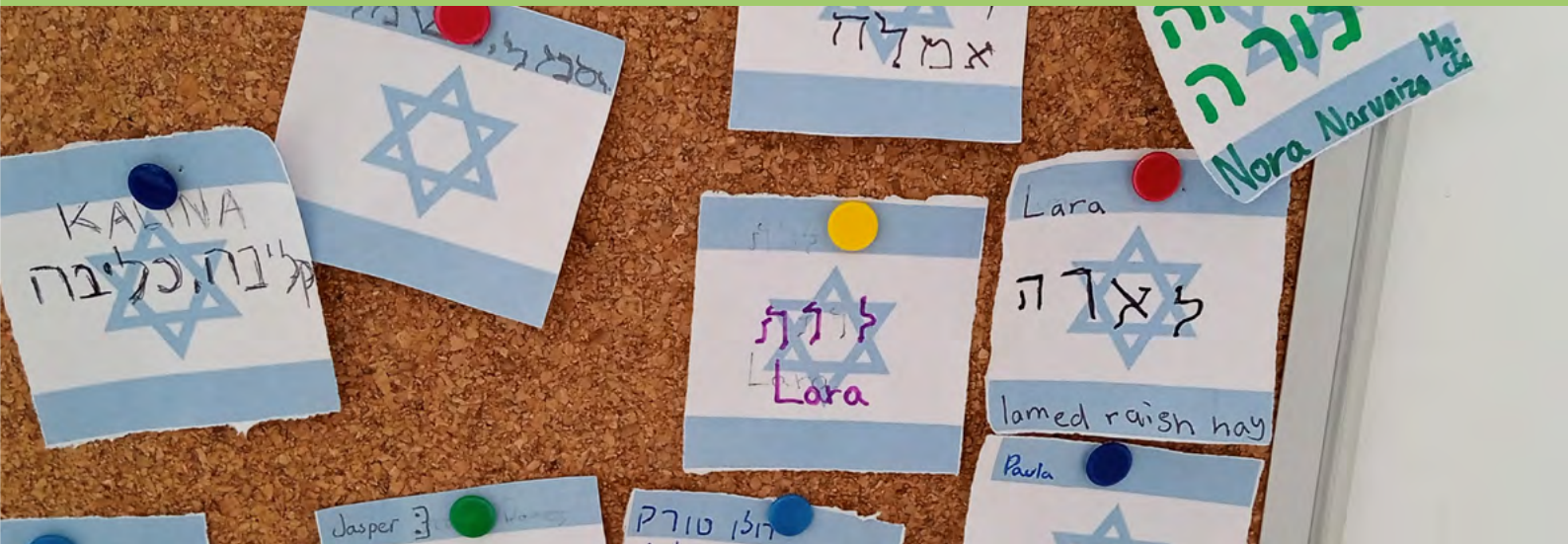

LANGUAGE OF THE MONTH NEWSLETTER: HEBREW

During September and October we have been celebrating Hebrew as our language of the month. We began with assemblies, learning about the Hebrew language and the culture of Hebrew speakers. We learnt, for example, that Hebrew is an ancient language that has been spoken for at least 3000 years. We also learnt that the Hebrew alphabet has 22 letters and that Hebrew is written and read from right to left. Our Hebrew speakers also taught us about Challah bread, Tapuach bedvash and how to say some things in Hebrew. (Shalom!) A really big thank you to all our Hebrew speakers, in particular Suf, Eyal, Gaya and Liam, who gave a fantastic assembly explaining their experience of speaking Hebrew and of Israeli and Jewish culture, well done!



After half term we will be celebrating Swedish. If any of our Swedish families would like to get involved, or if you have any new ideas, please let us know!

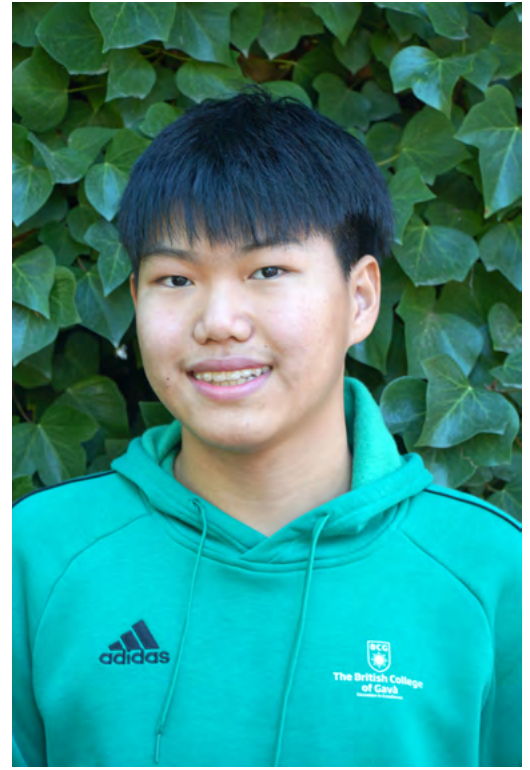

SEND NEWS

Dear parents,

In our wish to make the school an open thrilling educational community, the SEND department is offering a series of workshops aimed at parents. These will provide an opportunity to learn, understand and discuss ways to help your children at home.

Topic will be:

- **Dyslexia** - From a neuropsychological perspective we will unfold the dyslexic brain to understand what dyslexia is, how it affects learning, what strategies we use at school and how to help from home.
- **Emotional intelligence** - Emotional intelligence is a flexible set of skills that can be acquired and improved with practice. We will be exploring the core components of emotional intelligence zooming into emotional awareness and regulation. By teaching children appropriate ways of dealing with their emotions and the emotions of others, we will be helping them establish healthy relationships with the people around them and improving their quality of life as a whole.
- **ADHD** - ADHD is one of the most common neurodevelopmental disorders of childhood. In this workshop we will explore the neuropsychological pathways involved in attention, impulsivity and executive functioning, understanding what it means for a child with ADHD to learn at school and do homework, as well as how to manage behavior.
- **Growth Mindset** - A growth mindset is the understanding that we can develop our abilities and intelligence so that it isn't a fixed construct. In this workshop we will find out the implications of those beliefs in children's attitude towards learning and failure. Parents will get to know how they can support their children embracing challenges, taking feedback constructively, pushing themselves outside of their comfort zone and developing resilience and perseverance.
