Reflections

For me, the end of term is always time for reflection, appreciation and relief! It seems like years ago, not just months that we were in lockdown, learning virtually, such is the speed at which we get used to the new ways of leading our lives. All term we have worked very hard to ensure that everyone in our community remains safe from infection so that we can continue to teach the children. Everybody has played

their part in this endeavour, the teaching staff and the children have all managed to maintain a healthy appetite for learning but it is our support staff, and in particular our excellent catering and cleaning staff that have kept our school open.

When I was young, I used to love making models, in fact I was obsessed with it. So, I was delighted to see the creative skills of our Year 4 and Year 5 students displayed in school during this term. The Year 4 made excellent models of the Viking ships as part of their history lessons and the Year 5s ventured into OutSpace to create their solar systems. Other highlights for me include important awareness programmes like Black History month, slightly lighter, but no less important, Penguin class's growing tree. The Arts and Languages are a fundamental part of our curriculum and whilst limitations have been put on us due to the pandemic, our students have been develop-

ing their love for languages across the school and throughout the term. There were presentations in French and video competitions in Catalan. We have had excellent devised drama from the Year 7s who performed in their own masks that were created in the Art department. The weekly beat of the Samba, led by Victor Laguna was just one example of the wonderful music we have had this term. All this has been challenging and huge thanks go to the staff for ensuring these activities can run.

Student Voices are being heard

Students have had many different opportunities to share their views and I have been delighted at the way in which they have engaged positively in our weekly Student Forums. There have also been many great assemblies across all year groups this term but along with the burgeoning sustainability project, ESD, two stuck in my mind. The environment and how we treat it, featured in two assemblies in the secondary school. In one, Natasha and Kika presented a very convincing argument as to why we should reduce our consumption of fish and meat. With charts, videos and a well written script they presented to the Year 7 students in the auditorium whilst being beamed out across the school on live video. Such was their impact on the of the younger students that a week later I received 13 beautifully handwritten letters in a gold envelope all making suggestions of how the BCG community can help this crucial cause. The most popular suggestions were to stop eating meat at lunch and to reduce the use of plastic in our snacks. I was so impressed by the assembly and the letters that we will be introducing No Meat Monday next year and will also be reducing the packing we use on our snacks.

Head of Secondary and Head of Teaching and Learning

Following on from my announcement a few weeks ago that John Prince is leaving at the end of this term it is time to say goodbye. I met John Prince exactly a year ago and from the start appreciated his kind and generous nature. He has been very supportive of me and my plans for the school and we have become firm friends. John is fundamentally a very kind man who is caring and generous. He has brought his many experiences from a variety of settings to BCG and guided the school through a very difficult time. He leaves the school in far better shape than it was when he came 18 months ago. We all wish John the very best for the next chapter in his varied career and he will always be welcome to visit us at BCG

I am delighted to say that after a rigorous series of interviews and tests Mr Danny Steadman had been appointed as the new Head of Secondary from January 2021.

Given the increasing demands on the Secondary School I decided to split the original role into two. Mr Steadman will be responsible for the day to day running of the Secondary school as well as student behaviour and staff welfare. I will be interviewing for a Head of Teaching and Learning in the new year. The HoTL will be responsible for all academic matters in the Secondary School. I will perform this role until I have made an appointment.

Miss Fenton will be taking over Mr Steadman's Year 11 tutor group from January.






























Upper Primary

Year 7 Performance



As we entered the final school week of 2020 we finally managed to get to see the first BCG drama performance of the year! And the Year 7s managed to pull it off not just once, but EIGHT times, each one of their performances maintaining the magic and energy of the first. Dressed in black and white, their faces hidden by the mysterious, haunting owl and blackbird masks the students worked hard on in Art with Ms Jensen, the class took the stage, casting contorted shadows on the wall and began their version of Skellig, a magical realist tale about a young boy discovering a sick, depressed and tattered angel living in his family ´s dilapidated garage. It is a story of friendship and hope; of family and growing up. The students retold the novel they had studied in class by making "blackout poems" that charted Michael and Skellig ´s changes and transformations. These poems then became the basis for the first half of the play in which they used them as a script for their "Greek chorus". Written and devised entirely by the students, they experimented with soundscapes, unison speaking, ripple effects, echoes, and explored the ways in which moving together can create atmosphere and mood, and tell a story.

Following a powerful reading of the Persephone myth, which lies at the heart of the novel, by Leu, Raf and Noelia introduced the second half of the performance, a creative recital of William Blake's poem The Schoolboy which also lies at the heart of Skellig. The performance culminated with a huge crescendo of voices before they all collapsed on the stage floor and then rose to their feet for the applause. Eight times.
