Chromebooks

We have now reached the ideal time to move into a new technological phase in our teaching and learning. In secondary school our students are using

technology in almost all lessons for a whole variety of exciting purposes. We will be gradually introducing a Chromebook for All policy where each student will be required to have their own Chromebook at school. We have sourced an excellent machine which provides very high quality, reliability and useability. We will send specific details, including cost and payment option to parents in the coming weeks but this exciting programme will start for the Year 7 and Year 10 classes starting in September (ie students currently in Year 6 and Year 9).

Once we have established that programme we will continue to roll it out for other year groups in the secondary school.

Year 12 students starting their IBDP course will also be required to have laptop for the course as most of their work will require a high level of technology for reports, presentations, research, collaboration etc

UPDATE ON EYFS LP CLASSES FOR NEXT YEAR

Year 1 to 2

I am extremely happy to announce that we have a large number of new students joining our current Year 1 class, going into Year 2 in September. This means that in Year 2 we will split the class into two smaller classes of approximately 12 students. Our new children are coming from a local school where they are all currently in the same class. In the interest of a smooth transition, settling and building relationships for all the children, it is important that we mix new and current students, girls and boys and when doing this we will, of course, look at friendship groups. This is an exciting time for the children to have new friends in the year group! It is important to know that the whole year group (both classes) will be considered one bubble and will mix for various lessons and times throughout the day such as in Spanish, PE, lunch and playtimes, music and in Catalan-which is introduced in Year 2. In September, both classes will work on a shared topic using both classrooms and the garden area as a way for all children to settle into this new idea slowly. There will be trips, projects, assemblies and shows where the whole year group will come together and so there will be plenty of opportunities for old and new friends to play and learn together.
