### **Gavà's Mayor visit**

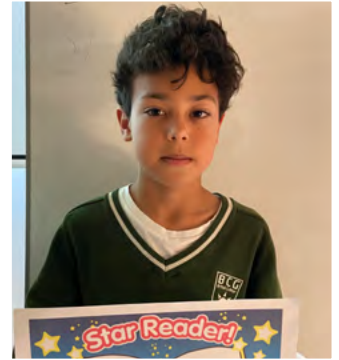

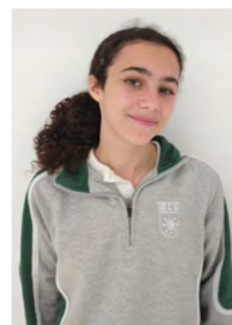

## Nursery & Reception

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Nursery and Reception classes went all the way to Barcelona city to see a performance of “Twinkle Twinkle Baby’s Star” in Palau de la Musica. The concert was performed by five amazing musicians who sang in three-part harmonies, played instruments, rapped and danced for an entire 45 minute show! The children watched as the musicians played the cello, double bass, ukulele, drums, chime bars, marimba, piano, violin, gong...and many more!

The concert covered Catalan and English nursery rhymes and songs. Among these were En Joan Petit, Dalt del cotxe, A Sailor went to sea, It’s raining, it’s pouring. The concert featured 28 different pieces which were performed in a seamless and engaging way for children aged 0-5 years. The children loved watching the light effects and thoroughly enjoyed watching the musicians move around the floor while performing. It was a big day out for the tiniest children of BCG and it is no wonder that we had a lot of children taking a nap on the bus back to school in the afternoon!

## Year 1 & 2

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Year 1 & 2 had the pleasure of attending a concert in L’Auditori, Barcelona. The concert, Els Colors del Metal, featured primarily instruments from the brass and woodwind families - trumpet, french horn, trombone, tuba and saxophone.

The show, which is designed for children in lower primary, was interactive and energetic which kept the children entertained for the full 45 minute performance!

After the concert the children enjoyed lunch at Parc Ciutadella where they had fun playing games before coming back to the school. It was a wonderful experience and one we look forward to recreating again next year when we plan our next music trip!

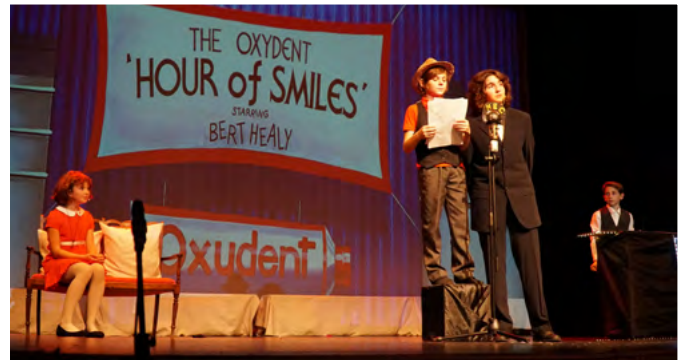

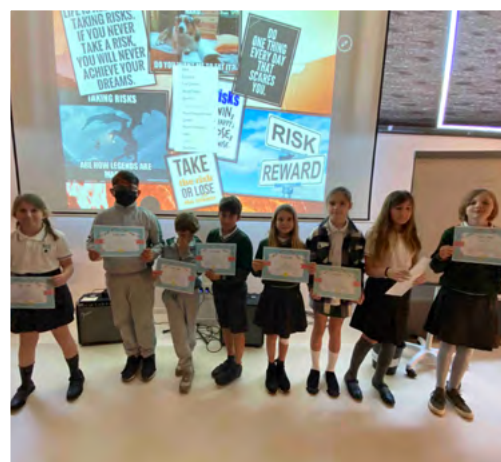


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
