THE PRE-IB PERSONAL PROJECT

Developing our research and writing skills in preparation for the IBDP...

The Pre-IB students have recently started their Personal Pre-IB Projects. This is an extended independent research task, modelled on the Extended Essay of the IBDP, designed to help the students develop their approaches to learning in terms of self-time management, research and independently working. The student had to choose their own research questions and with the help of myself and Mr. Fassam, focused these questions to ensure an effective piece of research could take place. Over the next few months the Pre-IB students, as well as sitting their mock examinations in January, will carry out their research to their questions, collate results, analyse them and provide their concluding thoughts to the hypothesis they originally suggested. This process will provide them with first hand experience of IBDP style work and will ensure the development of the key attributes they will need as they progress forward into the iB programme next year.

Below are some examples of the key questions the students are focusing on in their personal projects and their reasons for choosing that field of study.

To what extent is mobile phone addiction among teenagers a problem?

"I am studying this project because I find it very interesting that there are many people who are still not aware of the time they spend using mobile phones and screens."

Should steroids be legalised in bodybuilding?

"I am studying this because I have a keen interest in sports and I have always found this key sporting debate a fascinating topic. This project will enable me to develop my research skills and extended writing skills".

To what extent have smartphones had an impact on lives.

"I am studying this because I am interested in computer engineering and I think smartphones have had a huge impact on human lives. People depend on them in many everyday activities. Therefore I want to research just how much smartphones have changed human lives."

To what extent can the modern Antifa movement be classed as a terrorist group?

"I've chosen Antifa as my topic due to the fact i am keen to research their actions and the key events they have been part of in order to come up with a conclusion as to whether or not its fair to suggest they are a terrorist group? I am looking forward to researching this project and developing my inquiry skills."

PRIMARY CHRISTMAS CONCERTS!

With Christmas just around the corner I am delighted to announce the arrangements for the BCG Christmas Concerts 2021! In the spirit of Christmas, and in the interest of supporting parents with multiple children in the school, we have decided to stage two Christmas Concerts for all of EYFS and Primary. One performance for Nursery, Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 students and one performance for Year 3, Year 4, Year 5 and Year 6 students.

This year saw the beginning of not one, but two upper primary choirs and they are both very excited to share their first choir performance with you. Since September the children have had one choir lesson each week (as well as their weekly music lesson) where we explore vocal warm-ups, tonic solfa singing and songs from different genres. From pop songs and electronic music to Christmas carols and African songs, we have had a wonderful term learning together through the art of singing. In Ireland we have a phrase - "Ní neart go cur le chéile" which means "There's strength in numbers". This is never truer than when you hear a choir of children singing songs that they love together. For this reason, among others, we have decided to combine our two primary choirs for one magical Christmas performance. The performance will also feature our BCG Primary Orchestra full of young, enthusiastic musicians. The children of Year 3, 4, 5 & 6 and the Primary Orchestra will join together to sing, play and celebrate Christmas on Thursday, the 16th of December.

In accordance with Covid-19 measures the performance will take place in the Sports Hall with all windows and doors open for ventilation. All year groups will be socially distanced for the performance. Additionally, seating for parents/guardians will be separated into phases.



Our second performance will be for EYFS and Lower Primary children. This concert will have two parts. The Nursery and Reception children will open the show with their Christmas songs and then the Year 1 and Year 2 children will follow with their performance. The children are very excited about the show and I'm sure you'll enjoy some of the hilarious actions and dances we've added to the children's songs.

We are very hopeful that everything will go to plan but with Covid-19 cases in Spain increasing, there is a chance that things might change. For now, please keep your fingers crossed that we will be able to share our Christmas Concerts with you in BCG this Christmas and we will notify you if the regulations around these events change.

Dear Parents / Guardians,

Clubs Term 1

This current ECAP cycle ends on Thursday 16th December. Please be reminded that there are no clubs in the last week of term.

Clubs Term 2

The deadline to sign up for term 2 clubs is Friday 10th December 2021. It is really important that we have students allocated so that we can finalise contracts with external providers and teachers. Clubs with less than minimum numbers will be cancelled and those families require time to consider another club before we break for winter holidays.

Our Term 2 clubs will start immediately on the first week back, 10th January 2022 and end Thursday 31st March 2022.

Using the School Booking System

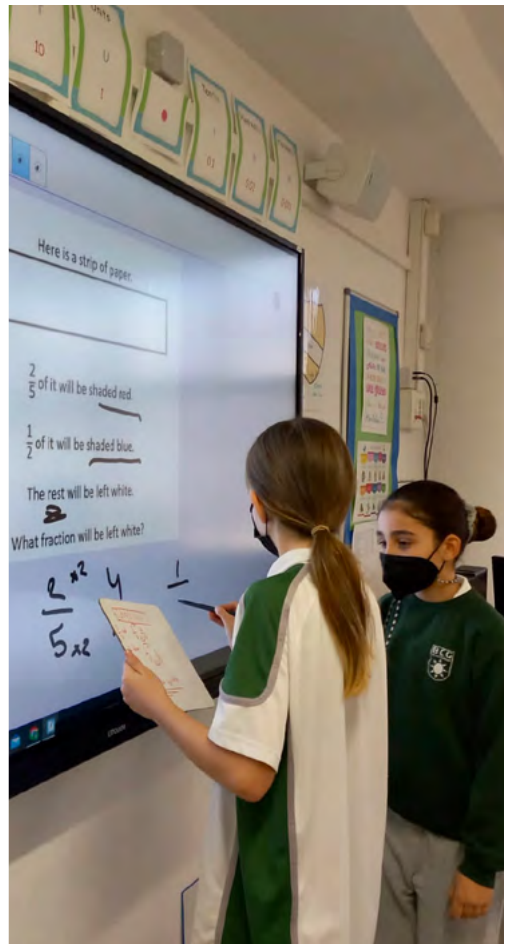
